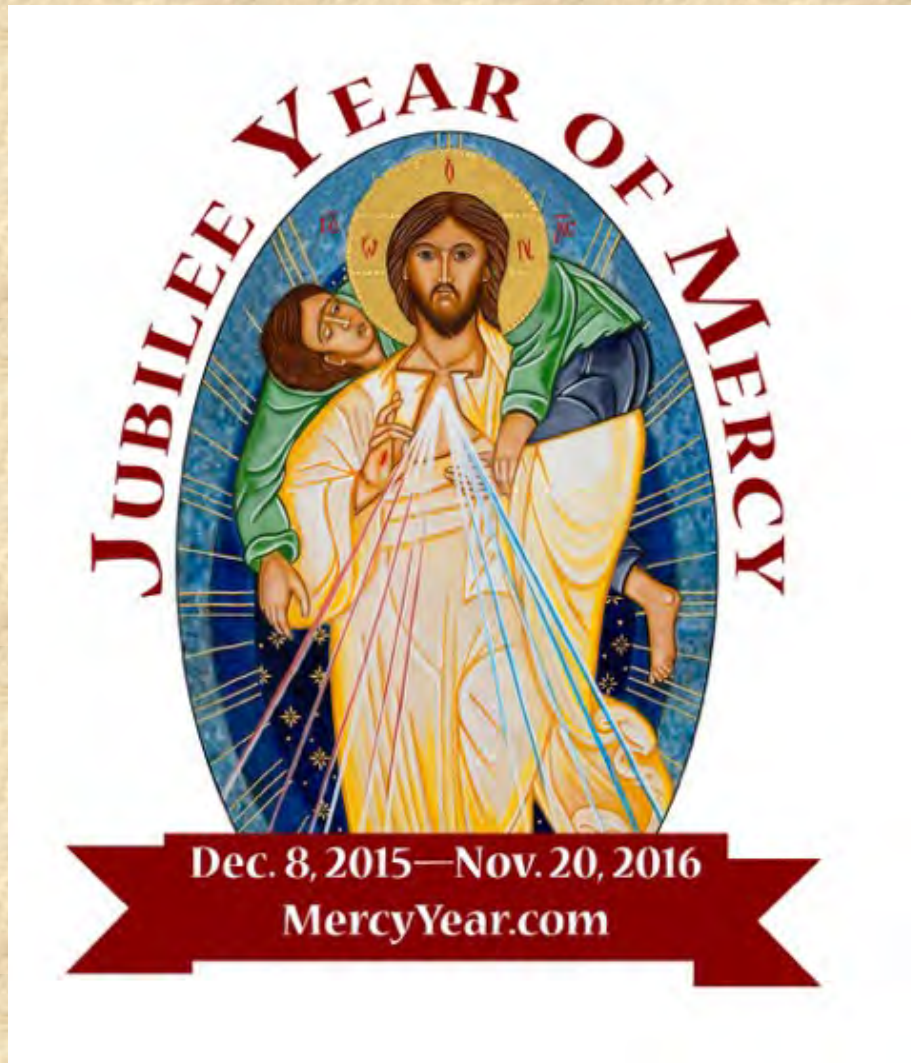

Pastor's Letter

November 19/20

Thanksgiving Unites Us

Dear Parish Family,

A sign in the cardiac rehab unit at a local hospital says it all: "All Political Discussions are Forbidden." I guess it is no mystery to the hospital staff that, along with all the usual risks to a healthy heart, our different views on things political could dangerously raise one's blood pressure. But everyone knows that. It has become more and more obvious over these last weeks that we are very much a nation divided, not only in our thinking about who would get our vote but in our most fundamental attitudes toward, race, gender, citizenship, economy, and other significant issues.

I have often noticed that Thanksgiving is just about the only thing we all agree on. You never meet someone who says that they don't celebrate Thanksgiving. No one is offended by being greeted with "Happy Thanksgiving." I can't imagine anyone saying that to be thankful is a terrible idea! Perhaps this Thanksgiving will be especially meaningful to us all.

The story of Thanksgiving, however accurately or inaccurately we tell it, seems hopeful. It tells us that colonists, explorers, and Native Americans could sit at table of thanksgiving together. That they could be thankful in a time of adversity. Knowing that God was the source of these blessings holds promise for us today.

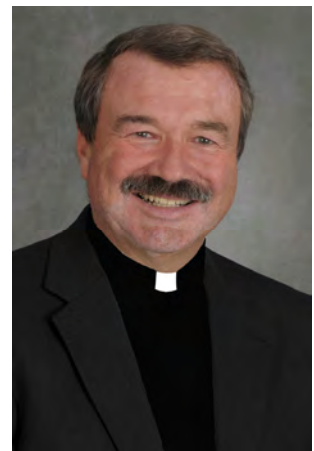
A key to resolving differences is understanding. The ability to know and value another even when understanding is difficult is fundamental to our unity. It is easy to look only at our own families, our own cultures, our own races, viewpoints, advantages, and blessings. That we are all God's children and that our lives are equally important is a fundamental teaching of our faith. In the history of our nation this faith-based knowledge has been a key to our unity and strength. In the best sense, we are one nation under God. So please come join us on Thanksgiving Day. Let's be one. Let's pray together. Let us ask the God of all creation to help us to be together in our thanks.

St. Agnes Medal 2016

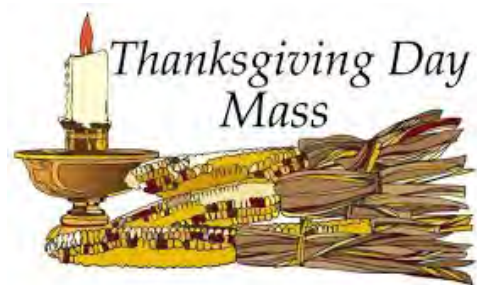

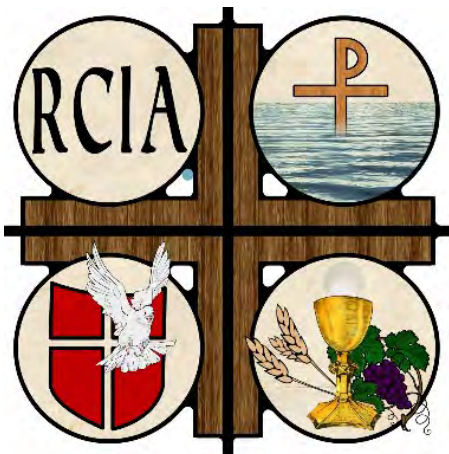

Legion of Mary

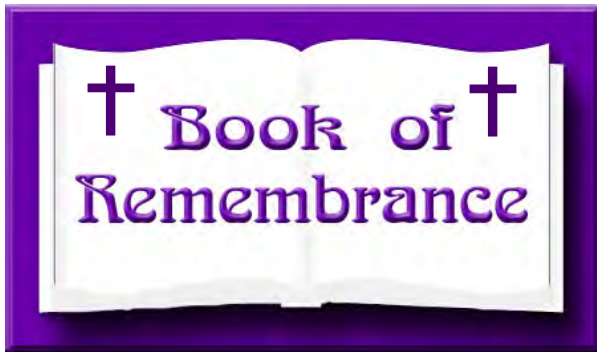

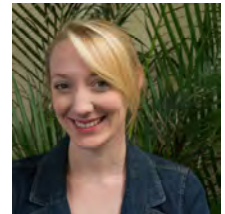

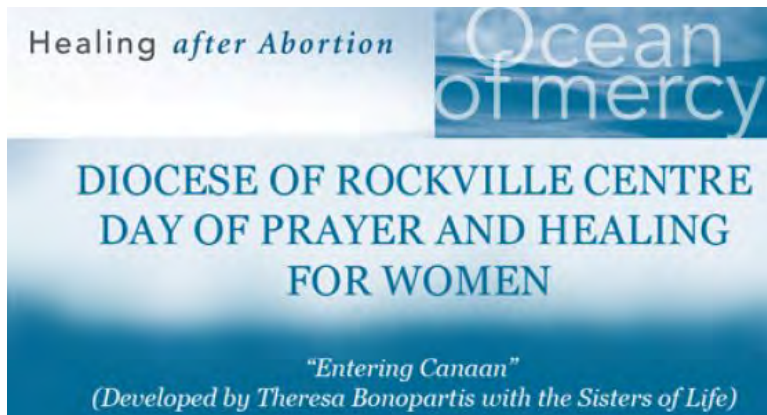


Sunday marks the end of another liturgical year, and, as always, we end the year by celebrating Christ as King. But why? Certainly Jesus was no king in the way that we know kings in history. He did not have a geographic realm. He did not live in a castle staffed by underlings who catered to his every need and desire. He did not rule a populace that simply existed to work his land, provide his food, fight his battles, and suffer harsh consequences if they disappointed him in any way. Instead, Jesus was the one who served, who fed the hungry, protected the vulnerable, healed the sick, who endured criticism, accusations, mockery, and ultimate torture and execution. What kind of king is that? In fact, he is one who *does* command. He commands us to love as he loved, to serve as he served, to give as he gave, and to endure suffering as he endured it. As we commemorate Christ the King, let us remember the kind of King we have.

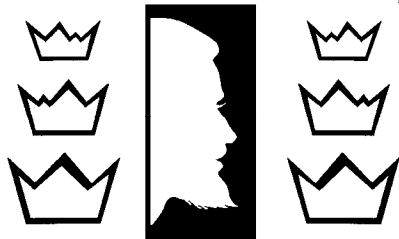

Monseñor Romero nos enseña sobre Cristo Rey – El pueblo peregrino en la tierra que marcha guiado por el Espíritu del Señor y por su divino conductor,

Cristo, rey de las naciones, llega al final del año litúrgico. Como que termina, pues, una meta de esta peregrinación. El año litúrgico es el despliegue, a lo largo de los doce meses, de la personalidad de este rey y de su reino, de sus características. De modo que, a esta altura, todos nosotros que gloriamos del título de cristianos, debíamos de estar más conscientes del personaje que seguimos, Cristo rey, y de las características del reino al que él nos ha convocado y nos ha admitido por el bautismo. Este reino, y este rey, está bien encarnado en esta tierra. Su reino es un reino para los hombres, concretos de la historia.

Así, hermanos, cuánto bien haríamos si en vez de difamarnos desacreditarnos, y odiarnos, trabajáramos como un solo pueblo sacerdotal, orientando con Cristo hacia Dios esta naturaleza creada para Dios. Y como profeta, Cristo nos ha hecho también participantes de su misión de llevar la palabra, el mensaje. El padre de familia es sacerdote en su hogar y profeta. Tiene que corregir, tiene que orientar. El patrono, el profesional también tienen, todos, hermanos, aquí no hay nadie en la Catedral, no los que están escuchando por radio, no hay nadie que no tenga una misión profética, la misión profética de anunciar el reino de Cristo, de denunciar los pecados contra este reino y de atraer a todo el mundo hacia Cristo.

Y finalmente, la función de Cristo rey; su realeza quiere decir un reino social, un reino de justicia cristiana, de amor y de paz. Todos tenemos que colaborar para que los bienes creados por Dios las cosechas que ahora se están levantando, las leyes, las estructura sociales, económicas, políticas, respeten los derechos de los hijos de Dios. Sea el reino de Dios verdaderamente una realidad que abre los caminos a la predicación del evangelio. *Tomado de la Homilía de Mons. Oscar Romero, 20 de noviembre de 1977*

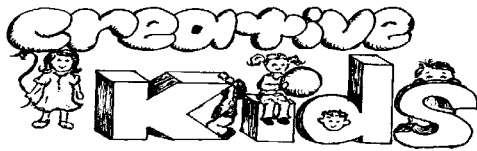
Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.

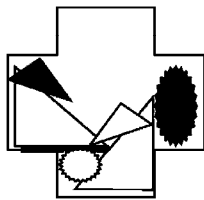


Mosaic Cross

4. Place the pieces on the glue. Try to cover as much of the white spaces inside the cross as possible.



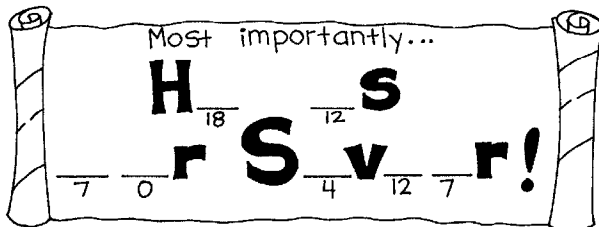
