Pastor's Letter

November 26/27

Waiting for....

Dear Parish Family,

Advent is the name given to this short season of preparation for Christmas. It has often been described as a season of waiting, waiting for Christ to come into the world. It fits nicely with the anxious waiting of children for the arrival of Christmas Day with its joyful giving of gifts. But this season of waiting has its roots in something much more profound. In our religious history, the waiting for the messiah was not just the waiting for the arrival of a person, but also for what that person would bring to the world. The age of the messiah was to be a time of justice, peace, and the end of want and emptiness.

If one were to look at the world or the nation or the families we are part of, we would see that there is plenty of waiting in the world today for those things which the messiah would bring. The Christmas story in the gospel of Luke describes how Mary and Joseph encountered all the problems of the world at their child's birth: a forced census of the world, treachery of an unjust government trying to destroy their child, and of course the simple lack of welcome – there was no room in the inn for the messiah's birth!

We read this gospel with full knowledge that the story ends with the resurrection of the Lord and the mission to spread good news to the world. The waiting of Advent is not waiting for someone else, even God, to do something about the troubles of the world. It is an invitation to begin to bring the age of the messiah. In other words, if we asked what God is waiting for, God might answer: For us!

So here are some suggestions about how to spend Advent (besides online shopping):

1. Make sure there is room in the inn. Someone always needs some room in your heart. Perhaps some of your kindness, some of your generosity, or some of your care is needed. Some stranger or someone you are apart from is knocking at your door. Share your bread, your time, your humanity.
2. Show kindness to a stranger or immigrant. People have suffered many harsh words this year and not just from the people on TV. When all is said and done we are one human race, on one planet, under one God. Take a moment to see it all from God's perspective and share that with someone else.
3. Be a peacemaker. Say the word that heals division. Value understanding more than differences. Take a chance on mercy and forgiveness.

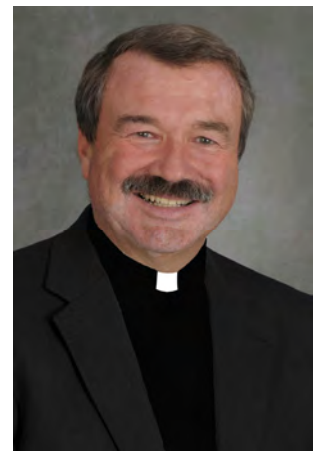
What are you waiting for, looking for, longing for this Advent? If you put this question to the Lord, he would likely tell us that he is waiting for us to make room in the inn, sing about and really want peace on earth, and be the first to extend God's own hand of friendship.

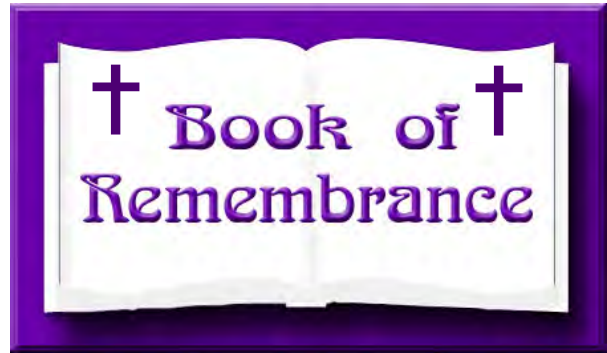

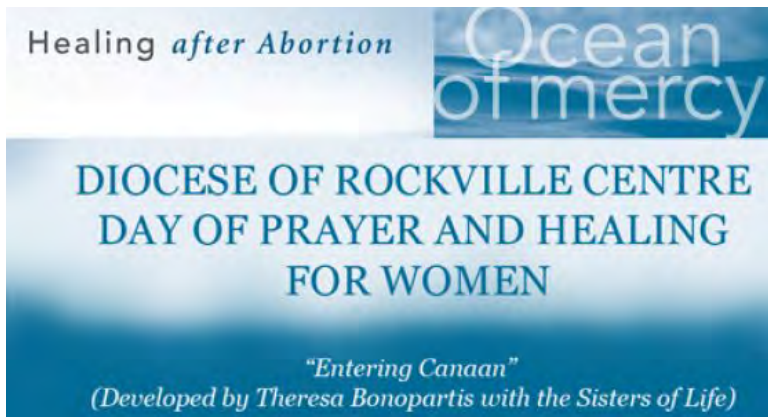

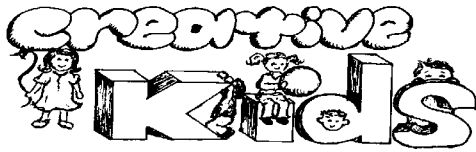
Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.

Example. Clean up trash at a park, pray together, read the bible, tell someone you love them, send a card to someone, help someone (dust, set the table).

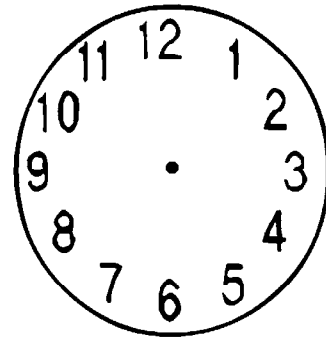

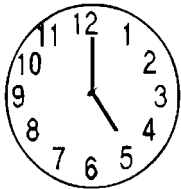
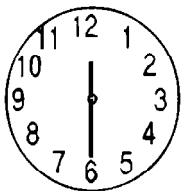
