

Pastor's Letter

January 21/22

Tell them about the Dream

Dear Parish Family,

This past Monday we celebrated the memory of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. It is hard to believe that almost fifty-four years have gone by since that August day in 1963 when, from the steps of the Lincoln Memorial, Dr. King spoke to thousands of people gathered on the National Mall for the March on Washington.

Generally Dr. King's speeches were passionate preaching rooted in his Baptist biblical tradition. But on that day in Washington, with millions gathered and the eyes of the world and the news upon him, King's speech seemed at first somber and academic. Many were waiting for that passionate biblical word. It was then, after he spoke for some 15 minutes that the singer Mahalia Jackson began to worry. She was only feet away from Dr. King and shouted out to him: "Tell them about the dream, Martin!" It was then that Dr. King set aside his text and spoke these famous words:

I say to you today, my friends, so even though we face the difficulties of today and tomorrow, I still have a dream. It is a dream deeply rooted in the American dream.

I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal.'

I have a dream that one day on the red hills of Georgia the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave owners will be able to sit down together at the table of brotherhood.

I have a dream that one day even the state of Mississippi, a state sweltering with the heat of injustice, sweltering with the heat of oppression, will be transformed into an oasis of freedom and justice.

I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character.

I have a dream today.

I have a dream that one day, down in Alabama, with its vicious racists, with its governor having his lips dripping with the words of interposition and nullification; one day right there in Alabama, little black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with little white boys and white girls as sisters and brothers.

I have a dream today.

I share this dream with you today because you will recognize that it is nothing less than the dream of God's kingdom we read each week in the scriptures. I share it because it belongs to each of us to keep that dream alive. I share it because it is the unique role of believers in our world to bring this dream to bear against the ideas, the passions, and the prejudices that can so easily divide us.

Tell them about the dream.



Be A Year Round Friend and Supporter of SHJM

It's that time of year when the days get colder and a time when many SHJM parishioners have active plans. The migration of summer visitors, people heading to warmer climates for the winter, vacations, and travels all diminish the numbers of those who are able to worship here each week. But please remember that our parish itself is here year round and we never take a break from service and ministry. Last year we began a program of planned, automated giving, called First Fruits. It was a huge success and well over 10% of our supporters participate in this way. It enabled our parish to maintain a more consistent year round income. Automated giving can help insure that our parish remains strongly supported. So here are some ways you can do this:

First Fruits: The easiest, and best if you are technologically challenged is to enroll in First Fruits. All you need to do is give us a void check and fill out a First Fruits Form. You can get one on our website, at the rectory, or at the back of church. First Fruits transfers a contribution either weekly or monthly from your checking account to the church.

Online Bill Pay: Chances are your bank already had a online check writing service called Bill Pay. If you have online access to your checking account you can set it up to write a regular check to SHJM. Just visit your online banking site and set it up for the contribution you desire. Remember to include your Envelope Number.

Pay Pal: Pay pal is another way you can make regular contributions. Soon it will also be a way that you can contribute using Credit Cards. Check our website and check back here for more information.



Reflections On the Gospel

January 22, 2017

How many of us would respond so spontaneously to an invitation as the Apostles did to Jesus in Sunday's Gospel? Were someone, even someone about whom we knew at least a bit from hearsay and about whom we were curious, to approach us and say, "Follow me. I'll make you a new kind of professional," would we drop everything and go? What kind of attraction did Jesus have that led these men to do just that? He must have been pretty spectacular or at the very least intriguing. The fact is, Jesus does approach and invite us, possibly directly or possibly through others. When we are asked to speak out for the impoverished, the elderly or sick, when we are asked to offer a hand to the hungry or homeless, when we are asked to oppose war or to support environmental protection, could that be an invitation from Jesus to follow him in his ways of love and compassion, peace and justice? Let us be more attentive to the call and more inclined to say Yes!


Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.

Go Fish!


You will need a deck of cards and at least one other player.

1. Give each player 5 cards face down. Put the rest of the cards face down on the table and smear them around.
2. Players look at their cards as they hold them.
3. Player #1 asks Player #2 if s/he has any ___ (name of a card that Player #1 already has).
4. If Player #2 has any cards that were asked for, s/he must give them to Player #1. It remains Player #1's turn to ask again for a different card.
5. If Player #2 does not have the card asked for then Player #1 must "Go Fish" from the pile in the middle and it becomes Player #2's turn to ask.
6. The object of the game is to get a set of all four of the same card. Example: Collect all four kings or 8s. The player with the most sets wins the game.
7. When a player collects all four of the same card, s/he may place that set down on the table. Then go to the pile and take as many cards as needed to keep 5 cards at all times. If a player has more than 5 cards s/he does not take any cards out of the middle.
8. Keep up the game until all cards are out of the middle and placed on the table in sets.
