Pastor's Letter

All I Know Is This. . .

March 25/26

Dear Parish Family,

There is something wonderfully simple and different about the story in John's gospel of the man born blind. Unlike many of the stories of Jesus healing, this story does not begin with a plea from the blind man himself. In most gospel stories it is the suffering person who cries out for help. A good example is the healing of Bartimaeus. He gets Jesus' attention by crying out "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" But that is not what happens here.

In the story of the man born blind it is a seemingly curious and theological question from the disciples that begins the miracle. Passing the blind man they ask "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" This is the kind of question that people ask priests and ministers every day. Why am I suffering? Why do some people have such bad luck and others are blessed? I am sure you have asked this question yourself, maybe more than once.

Jesus answers simply – Neither. It is not anyone's fault, not the man, and not his parents. I suppose he might have left it right there. Suffering is a mystery; some are blind, some are not. It's no one's fault. But he goes a bit further: "It is so that the works of God might be made visible through him." Then without even asking the blind man for permission, Jesus just heals him.

The miracle opens a storm of questions. Was he really blind? Who healed him? Who had authority to do this? And, from the religious authorities, why were we not consulted! Everyone is questioned. The bystanders. People in the town who knew him. His parents. And, of course, the man himself.


It is the man's response that I love the best: "One thing I do know is that I was blind and now I see." I think that every Christian needs to remember those words. I was and now I am. I was lost and now am found. I was blind and now I see. I was deaf and now I hear. I was sick and now I am well. I was an unbeliever and now I believe.

This week in our parish mission we will hear some profound stories of how people have come to the miracle of faith. From a physician, from our new bishop, and from me, stories of faith will be told. Come to hear them. Bring your own story along too!



Be A Year Round Friend and Supporter of SHJM

It's that time of year when the days get colder and a time when many SHJM parishioners have active plans. The migration of summer visitors, people heading to warmer climes for the winter, vacations, and travels all diminish the numbers of those who are able to worship here each week. But please remember that our parish itself is here year round and we never take a break from service and ministry. Last year we began a program of planned, automated giving, called First Fruits. It was a huge success and well over 10% of our supporters participate in this way. It enabled our parish to maintain a more consistent year round income. Automated giving can help insure that our parish remains strongly supported. So here are some ways you can do this:

First Fruits: The easiest, and best if you are technologically challenged is to enroll in First Fruits. All you need to do is give us a void check and fill out a First Fruits Form. You can get one on our website, at the rectory, or at the back of church. First Fruits transfers a contribution either weekly or monthly from your checking account to the church.

Online Bill Pay: Chances are your bank already had a online check writing service called Bill Pay. If you have online access to your checking account you can set it up to write a regular check to SHJM. Just visit your online banking site and set it up for the contribution you desire. Remember to include your Envelope Number.



Pay Pal: Pay pal is another way you can make regular contributions. Soon it will also be a way that you can contribute using Credit Cards. Check our website and check back here for more information.



Ayuno, Abstinencia y Actos de Penitencia para la Cuaresma: Los obispos de los Estados Unidos prescriben, como obligación mínima, que todas las personas que han cumplido los catorce años y los mayores de catorce están obligadas a abstenerse de comer carne todos los viernes de cuaresma. Además, todas las personas desde los dieciocho años de edad hasta los cincuenta y nueve años, inclusivos, están obligadas a ayunar limitándose a una sola comida completa el viernes santo, mientras las otras dos comidas en esos días deben ser ligeras.

He venido a este mundo para que los ciegos vean – El Evangelio de San Juan nos relata que Jesús sanó a un ciego de nacimiento. Puso lodo sobre los ojos del ciego y le mandó que se lavara “en la piscina de Siloé. Él fue, se lavó y volvió con vista.”

Imagínese el gozo que él sintió al ver un mundo nuevo revelándose delante de sus ojos. Ya podía ver y comprender cosas nuevas, cosas que nunca había entendido antes. Sin embargo, la sanación de sus ojos fue solo un símbolo de una sanación más profundo que hizo Jesús, una sanación interior. Cuando Jesús dice que ha venido a este mundo para que los ciegos vean, está hablando que quiere darnos la fe, la habilidad de ver que Jesús es el Hijo de Dios y de creer en Él. El ciego ve y se postra para adorar a Jesús, mientras los fariseos no ven y no creen en Cristo.


Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.
