# Pastor's Letter

April 1/2

Dear Parish Family,

## The Letter to Timothy

In his mission talk this week Dr. Michael Egnor told us that for him, powerful witnesses to faith were ordinary people who managed to cope and even to thrive in very difficult situations because of their faith. As priest and pastor, I see this every day. From time to time it is good for me to share some of these experiences with you.

Just a few weeks ago, at the beginning of Lent, our parish lost a wonderful man – Tim Lynch. Tim was an active and supportive parishioner, a Eucharistic minister at Mass, and a person who attended and supported every part of parish life. Tim had also been fighting a battle with prostate cancer for several years. His case was particularly difficult but he underwent treatment, and these treatments gave him three extra years.

What impressed me about Tim was that he never complained about his battle. In fact, he never spoke much about it at all. But when he did, he spoke only of the gratitude in his heart for these extra years to live. Even in the last few weeks of his life, when he had much discomfort and could not come to Mass each day, he spoke only of the gratitude in his heart for life itself and for the extra years he was given.

Tim often reminded me of Timothy, the one St. Paul wrote to in his letters. We don't have Timothy's letters to Paul, but it seems that Timothy had written to Paul to ask for help dealing with the challenges and difficulties of being a leader in the early Christian community. Paul wrote back with some practical advice but mostly with the assurance that if Timothy could face his challenges with perseverance and faith, he would be at peace.


*But as for me I am already being poured out like a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith. From now on a merited crown of righteous awaits me, which the Lord, the just judge that God is, will award to me on that day, and not only to me, but to all who have waited for the Lord with eager longing.*

Those of us who are still running the race often need the example of people who, like Tim, fight the good fight, finish the race, and keep the faith. As Lent comes to a conclusion, we see Jesus this week raising his friend Lazarus from the dead. This miracle is a sign of Jesus' his own resurrection and by giving this gift to his friends he gives them the courage to continue their own journey, full of hope. I am grateful for all those in our lives who help us, even in hardest times, to be believers.

## Be A Year Round Friend and Supporter of SHJM

It's that time of year when the days get colder and a time when many SHJM parishioners have active plans. The migration of summer visitors, people heading to warmer climes for the winter, vacations, and travels all diminish the numbers of those who are able to worship here each week. But please remember that our parish itself is here year round and we never take a break from service and ministry. Last year we began a program of planned, automated giving, called First Fruits. It was a huge success and well over 10% of our supporters participate in this way. It enabled our parish to maintain a more consistent year round income. Automated giving can help insure that our parish remains strongly supported. So here are some ways you can do this:

**First Fruits:** The easiest, and best if you are technologically challenged is to enroll in First Fruits. All you need to do is give us a void check and fill out a First Fruits Form. You can get one on our website, at the rectory, or at the back of church. First Fruits transfers a contribution either weekly or monthly from your checking account to the church.

**Online Bill Pay:** Chances are your bank already had a online check writing service called Bill Pay. If you have online access to your checking account you can set it up to write a regular check to SHJM. Just visit your online banking site and set it up for the contribution you desire. Remember to include your Envelope Number.



**Pay Pal:** Pay pal is another way you can make regular contributions. Soon it will also be a way that you can contribute using Credit Cards. Check our website and check back here for more information.






