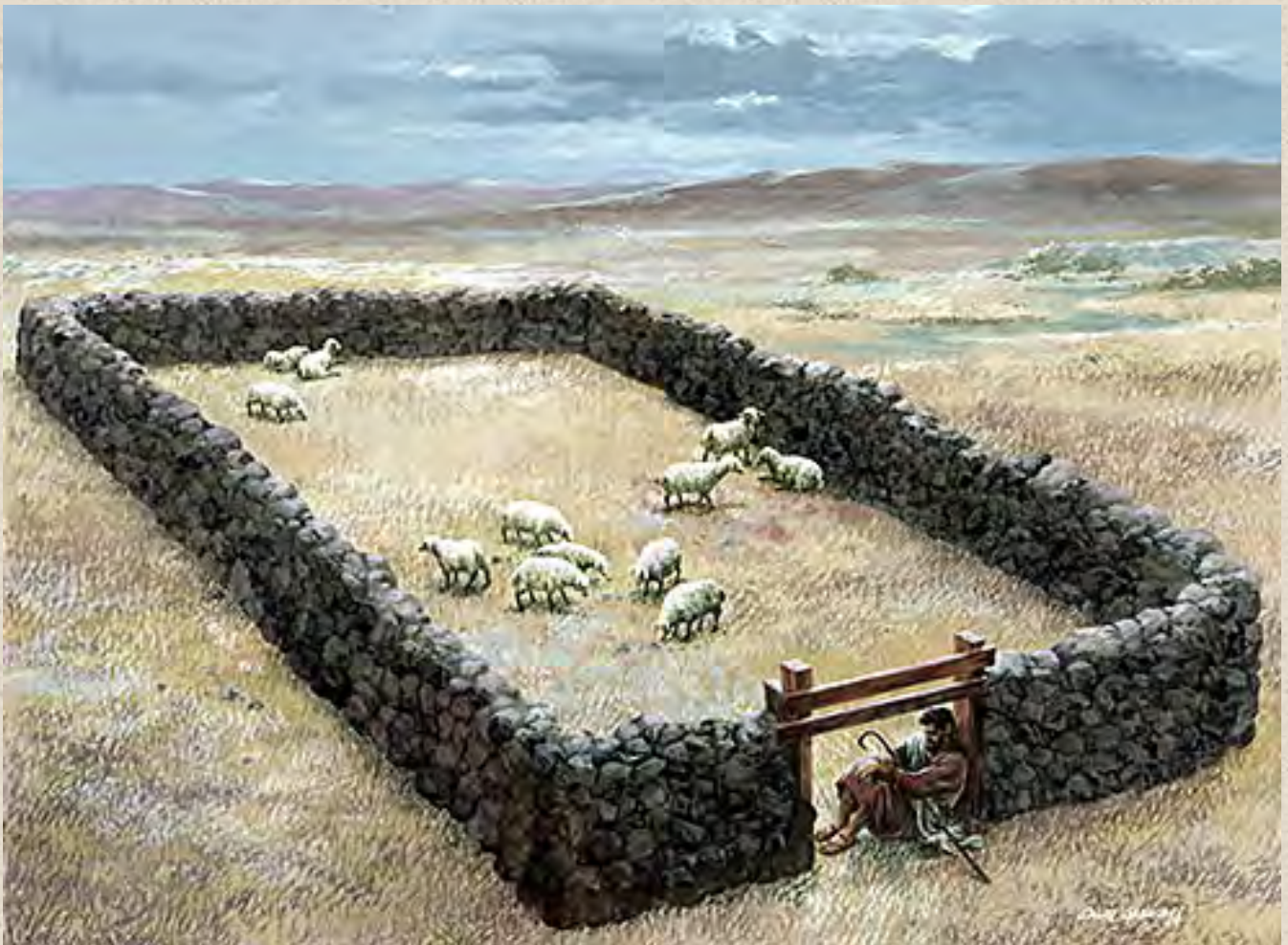

Pastor's Letter

May 6/7

We All Need A Good Shepherd

Dear Parish Family,

I had played golf for many years before I ever took a lesson. It looked obvious enough. Hit the ball with the club. I watched professional golfers doing this and in my delusion figured I probably looked something like them. When I finally took a lesson, the Pro took a video of my swing. I was shocked at how awful I looked. No one would mistake me for one of those professionals. If I were going to enjoy this game better I would need to take some lessons. I would need a coach!

My letter this week is not about golf; it is about life. In striving to do their best athletes needs a coach, writers have an editor, students have teachers, and many professionals have a mentor. Christianity is about leading a good life and, in the same way, it is hard to get better at living a Christian life without some help. Not surprisingly, many of us try to go it alone, as I did at golf. But some of us discover that there is good help available. The helper is Christ but we don't call him coach - we call him shepherd.

For the first Christians, the good shepherd was one of their most important images of Christ. Jesus described himself as the good shepherd and promised to always search for and find the lost sheep. Like a shepherd He would be their protector and guide, and when it came to finding the right place to be and to rest - He would be the gate. So how can we be connected to this shepherd? Here are three suggestions:

One - Read the book. The Bible. Particularly the gospels. Bishop Barres, in his mission talk here, wondered what would happen if we consulted the Bible as often as our iPhone. I bet you know people who cannot go even a few minutes without checking for a message. What might happen if I checked the Bible for a message, even just once a day? I would get better at Christianity. The word of God is powerful.

Two - Talk to the shepherd. If you got this bulletin at church you already took a serious step in that direction. Take the Eucharist with you through the week. A great thing to do at Mass is to take one lesson and hold onto it all week. It might be in the readings, in the prayers, in the sermon, or in the music. I assure you there is a message for you today. Look for it and hold onto it through the week.

Three - Be open to reconciliation. People sometimes ask me why we should think about reconciliation. Are we really that bad? Well sometimes we do need forgiveness in a very serious way, but more often we just need to work on one points of life in our efforts to get better. A priest friend, Fr. George Deas, once said that if you go to reconciliation regularly you cannot help but become a good person. Part of getting better at Christianity is working on our weak points.

Life is so much more important than any game we play. On this Good Shepherd Sunday let's recognize that we are not alone on this journey of life. We have a great coach. A Good Shepherd.

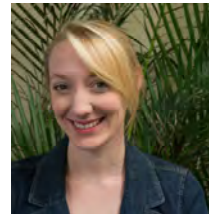

**Reflections On the Gospel
 May 7, 2017**

Sunday’s readings can be very reassuring, but they can also be very disturbing. How can they be both? First, we hear St. Peter telling those who crucified Jesus that they can be saved through repentance and baptism. The Holy Spirit will come to them if they but abandon the corruption of their generation. In the second reading, St. Peter assures the people that they have been healed through Jesus’ suffering; they are no longer lost, but returned to the right path. In the Gospel Jesus also offers comfort, but then he makes it clear that there are thieves out there trying to mislead and destroy. These false guides are still with us today. Those who profess to be looking out for our interests while they move to deny health care to the sick, shelter to the homeless, food to the hungry, sanctuary to the refugee, education to the ignorant, jobs to the unemployed, care to the environment and who profit from prisons, war and weaponry are the thieves whose path is a dead end and whose pasture is barren. We must not let them lure us away from the Good Shepherd. We must tune our ears to the one, true voice that is our Life and Salvation.

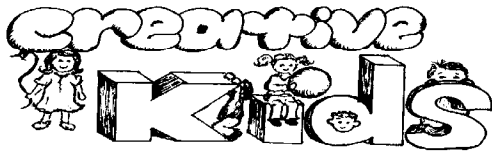
Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.

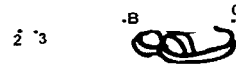
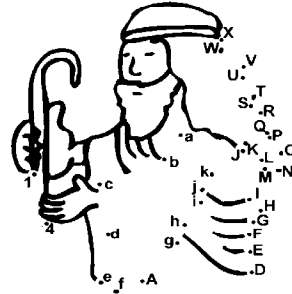

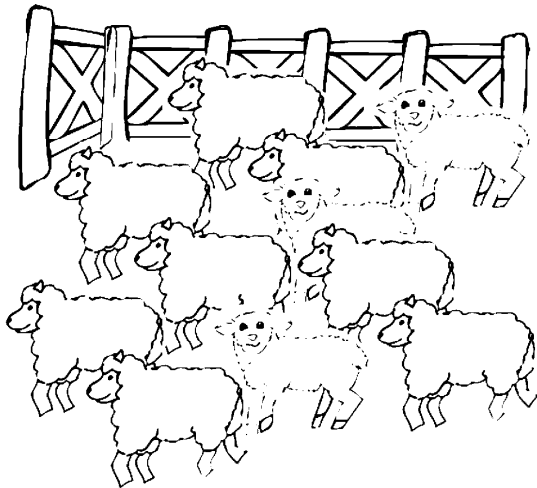
