Passing on Our Faith

Dear Parish Family,

At First Communion Masses I like to show the children one of my treasures and ask them what they think it is worth. I often show them a pair of men's cufflinks and ask if they would trade them for some of their First Communion cards! The answer is always a resounding NO! Then I point out that the cuff links were a wedding day gift from my grandmother to my grandfather. When I ask again if they think I would really sell them, now that they know the story, they get the point that these treasures are truly priceless.

My point is that First Communion is like that. Simple gifts, bread and wine, blessed and shared. But now that they know the story of how Jesus blessed the bread and wine and shared it with the disciples, they understand that the Eucharist is priceless.

This year when I asked the class why I would not sell the cufflinks, a very precocious young man replied: "Because they were passed down to you from one generation to another!" I could not have gotten a better answer if I had set the kid up.

Faith is passed down. Your faith is passed down. So is mine. I would not be a believer if someone else had not passed it down to me. This work of passing on the faith is one of the most challenging and important things our parish does.

Think about helping us this year. Maybe you can be a catechist or a teacher's assistant. Maybe you can help us put great learning materials together. Maybe you can help us with the organization and the week by week work of running a religious education program.

Please help us pass the gift along. Faith, after all, is something priceless.

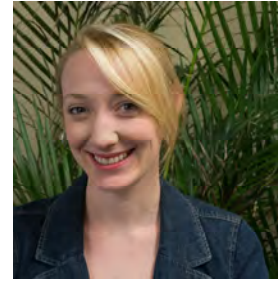

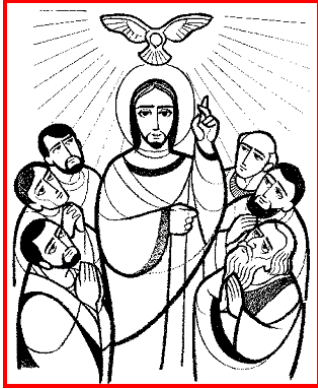

Reflections On the Gospel

May 21, 2017

Sunday's readings are precursors to the upcoming feasts of the Ascension and Pentecost. First, we have Jesus telling his disciples, "In a little while the world will no longer see me...." Then we have St. Luke reporting that Peter and John went to Samaria to lay hands on the people that they might receive the Holy Spirit. These two messages are intimately linked. Jesus is leaving, but sending the Holy Spirit. Of such is the hope about which St. Peter writes in the Second Reading. Of such is also the joy in which we can all share. Although Jesus has left our earthly home, he is still with us. We can continue to see him in one another imbued with the Holy Spirit. But do we? And if we do, do we accept the fact that sometimes we may be maligned for doing the good that Jesus would have us do and that the Spirit enables us to do? Let us be open to the Spirit that we might do good no matter the cost.

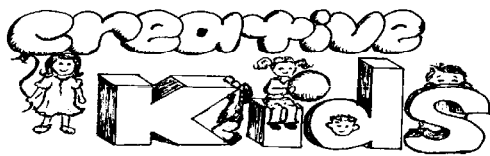

Coffee Filter Butterfly

You will need:
coffee filter
clothes pin
paint
water

1. Lay out your coffee filter and smooth it down flat.
2. Use your paints and water to paint different colors all over the filter. The colors will run into each other if your paint brush is really wet.
3. After the paint dries, gather the middle of the filter and clothes pin it together.
4. Open the ends of the filter to display the beautiful butterfly wings.
5. Draw or paint 2 eyes on top of the clothes pin for the eyes if you wish.

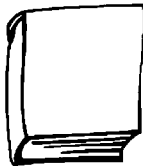
For extra fun, put a strip of magnetic tape on the back and display your butterfly on the refrigerator.
Or simply tie it to the string of your blinds so it can be flying around your window.

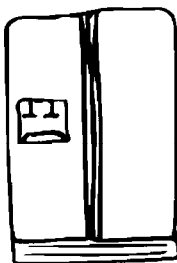
Directions: Write or draw a picture of when you had to choose between right and wrong and the Spirit helped you choose the right path.
