# Pastor's Letter

September 30/October 1

## Our Basilica Doors

Dear Parish Family,

It was just one year ago that we were in the last weeks of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. This celebration brought thousands of people to visit our church and walk through our doors of mercy. The doors of a church are powerfully symbolic. They are open in a great sign of welcome, both to this community and to the arms of God. They speak to us of strength, guarding us from spiritual harm. They welcome children to baptism, couples to marriage, and loved ones to eternal life.

The doors of our church are almost certainly original. They are over 110 years old and are beginning to show the wear and tear of all those years. They are etched by salty air, bleached and dried by the sun, and lovingly worn by all those thousand hands and bodies that push them open, pull them closed, bump and bruise them. We do our best to keep up but after all these years it is time to give them some serious help. There are ten exterior oak doors and this fall we will soon do for them what we recently did for the pews of our church.

During the next few weeks, weather permitting, each of our doors will be restored by an onsite crew who will dismount them, strip the layers of old stain and varnish, sand away the scratches and bumps, and provide a new and strong finish, just as had been done for our pews. This work of restoration is a costly and specialized task but the good news is that it will be done through a generous grant from the Powers Family Foundation.

If you have a chance today, take a look at our doors. Soon they will be restored to the original beauty that was present when they were first installed over 110 years ago! A huge thank you to John and Linda Powers and family for helping us in so many ways to preserve the beauty of our Basilica Church.

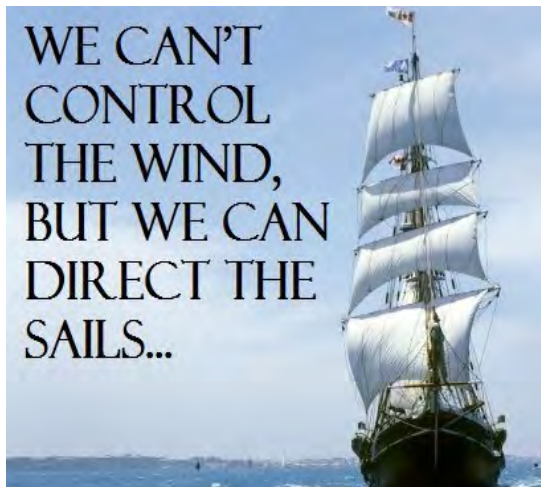

The message of Sunday's readings could be, "Practice what you preach" or "Do what you say." The First Reading and the Gospel make it clear it doesn't matter who you are but what you do. Jesus makes it even more explicit: Tax collectors and prostitutes are entering heaven before the chief priests and elders because they believed and changed their ways. It's not enough to say you'll do something; you must follow through. And what must we do? St. Paul makes it simple: Put others first. Today we witness so much hypocrisy, claiming to want peace while investing a trillion dollars to upgrade nuclear weapons and threatening war in countries a mere shadow of ourselves, claiming to care about people's health and welfare while cutting funds and services, claiming to appreciate the environment while removing all kinds of protections and refusing to take responsibility for its repair. Today we take pride in individual accomplishments or blame others for individual failures but fail to recognize that we are all interdependent and far more effective when we work in community. It's time we heed Sunday's scripture passages, believe, be true, humble, and of service to one another.

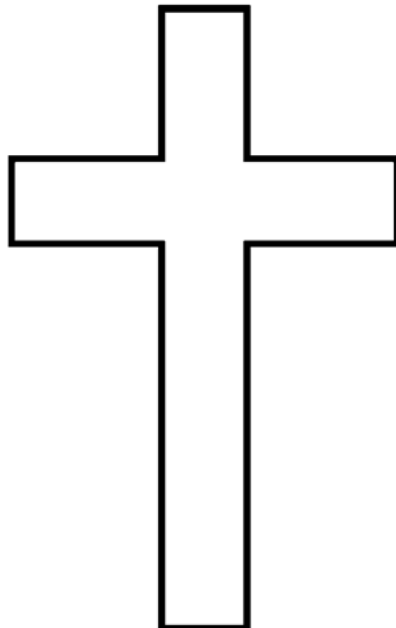
This is a contest between adults and children.
