Pastor's Letter

November 4/5

November Saints

Dear Parish Family,

On All Saints Day, with its beautiful readings about the triumph of the saints in heaven, I found myself thinking about some words from my catechism days: We are the Church Militant, Church Penitent, and Church Triumphant. The Church Militant are those of us who are here, alive and striving to live the Christian life here on earth. The Church Penitent are those who have passed away and who are now in that time of purification we call Purgatory. The Church Triumphant are those who have passed the test of life and purification and who are now in God's presence in heaven.

These are not three separate churches because we are one people, and in this time of year we celebrate that we are a community of saints. What does this mean? Well, it means that heaven, the kingdom of God, is right here. Heaven is also in the presence of those newly passed who are coming even closer to God. And heaven is surely the dwelling of those who, having passed the trials of life and their purification, are now in God's presence. They are also enjoying the full meaning of life itself – our unity with God.

It seems to me that people today find it harder and harder to believe that this future church is important and needed. In other words, we find it hard to believe that life here is not enough and that the life to come is even more precious than all we experience here. Perhaps we are so convinced of our own powers that we believe we can build here a lasting dwelling place.

In the Gospels Jesus speaks often of a great paradox: That heaven is already here and it is yet still to come. In other words, human life is good and precious but is only a glimpse of what St. Paul speaks of as the glory that is yet to come. In the Letter to the Corinthians Paul tells us that we see now darkly as one sees in a mirror – but one day we will see clearly and know God completely.

So what do the saints do all day? Well, our great heroes and heroines, and those friends and family close to us who have passed from this life – they cheer us on. They encourage us not to give up on our faith, our struggles, and the tests of this life. They tell us that one day we will be purified too and experience the triumph of heaven as they do.

November is the time of all saints. I am so grateful that we are still so much in touch with those who have gone before. They help us to know that heaven is here and heaven is still to come.

Preparación Pre Matrimonial – Para casarse por la

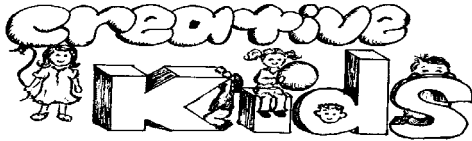
