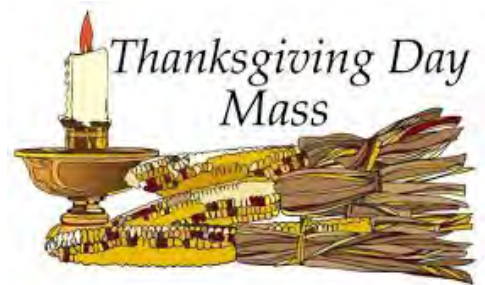

Confirmation

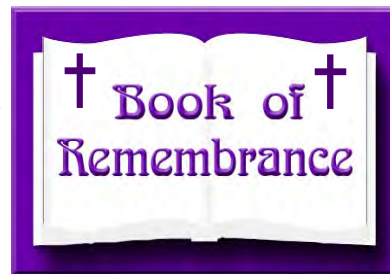
Bishop Andrzej Zglejszewski celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation this past Monday

You are welcome to attend in uniform if you wish or to wear another insignia or sign of your service. We welcome the opportunity during this month of thanksgiving to express our gratitude to you.



The message for Sunday's Gospel is quite clear: Be prepared. But what about the lesson to share what we have, even to the point of sacrifice? How is it that the virgins who refuse to share their oil are called "wise," while the virgins in need are called "foolish"? It's easy to say the answer lies in the moral to be prepared. But is it fair to lock out those who were simply short-sighted? There's a bit more to the answer, though, ultimately, it may land us in the same place. The so-called foolish virgins had the opportunity to get more oil as soon as they saw the example of the wise virgins. Clearly they had the means to get the additional oil, because they went for it later on. They also could have simply gone without. At least they would have been present when the bridegroom arrived. This was not a case of being denied an unattainable necessity; it was a case of selfishly wanting something from others without concern for what it would do to those others and without acknowledging that they had the means to take responsibility for themselves had they been conscientious enough to do so. Let's not just remember to be prepared, but let's remember what it requires of us.

Eucharistic Adoration Returns

The Catechism quotes Saint John Paul II: “The Church and the world have a great need for Eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go to meet him in adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the serious offenses and crimes of the world. Let our adoration never cease.



Our parish will renew the practice of an hour of Eucharistic Adoration following the noon mass on Fridays. We would like to dedicate this hour as a time of contemplation and reflection to pray especially for our families. For strength in family life, for the return of family members to the church, for healing and reconciliation within families that are hurting.



Our Lady of the Hamptons

The second grade class, led by their teachers Teresa Torres and Madeline Price, presented their assembly, “How Democracy Came to the Beehive”, a celebration of civics and government set to music.

The boys’ Cross Country team of OLH, coached by Mr. Ben Turnbull, captured their second diocesan championship in the last three years. Prep 7’s James Conigliario was the overall winner, closely followed by his teammate, Hector Maldonado of Prep 8. Finishing in the top ten of the two hundred runners were Derek Elasik and Harrison Hanley.

Outreach at OLH continues as November begins, with the distribution of special All Saints’ Day gifts to the seventy-five residents at Bishop Ryan Village, as well as to the sisters at St. Joseph’s Convent in Brentwood. Prep 7 students spent their second full lunchtime with the clients at Bridgehampton Nutrition Center. The school community has also been continuing collection and shipping of supplies to their adopted school in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

The special All Saints’ Day liturgy was concelebrated by Fathers Janusz Lipski, Ryan Creamer and John Wackowicz. The mass was planned by the first grade class, with these students doing the readings and presenting the gifts.

The annual Bucks for Books campaign to benefit the school programs at Our Lady of the Hamptons is on now and will culminate in the February 1 drawing of the prizes totaling twenty-five thousand dollars. Tickets are available now at the school. Call 283-9140 for details.

While the first trimester of the school year is just ending, it is already time to think of the possibilities for Catholic education at OLH for the 2018-19 school year. Registration will take place in late January, but information is available now. Placement in the elite OLH Prep program for grades 6,7 and 8 is at a premium, so early consideration is advised. This program features Regents level courses in Math and Science, as well as an aggressive ELA curriculum and integrated Fine Arts.

OLH Pre-school for young children is offered at the campus of St. Rosalie’s Church in Hampton Bays. There has been an outstanding response to the four year old program, and registration is now closed for this term. Early registration for the 2018-19 school year is beginning now. Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.

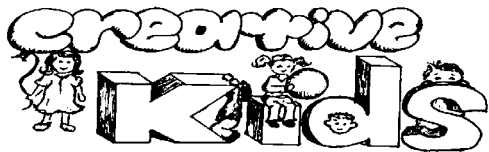

Decorated Door

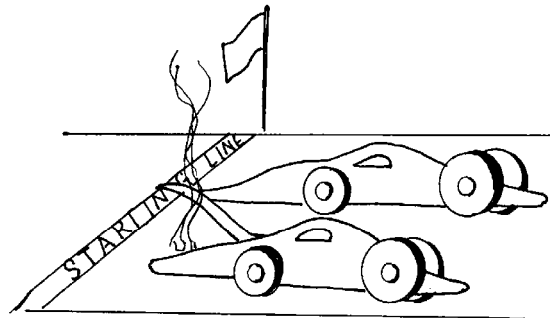
Be ready for Jesus if He comes knocking at your door. Create a welcoming decoration to hang on the child's bedroom door to remind him/her of Jesus.
