

November 25/26

Advent is Coming

Dear Parish Family,

I have a personal Thanksgiving tradition that I enjoy very much. On the day after Thanksgiving, Black Friday, a group of my hiking friends and I get together for a hike. We call it the leftover hike because we all bring along some Thanksgiving dinner leftovers. After a walk to work off the previous day's feast, we break out our stoves in the cool autumn air to warm up some delicious leftovers. We often head north to Harriman State Park where an easy hike gives us a wonderful view of the Hudson River valley. The view, the crisp air, and good friends make the leftovers taste even better.

I also take delight in thinking that Harriman is only a few minutes from the Woodbury Commons where Black Friday shoppers are enduring record crowds and hopeless traffic on a quest for the deals of a lifetime!

Advent, like Lent, is a penitential season (hence the blue and purple vestments). But Advent is different than Lent. It is shorter, there is no tradition of fasting or giving things up, and the readings at Mass are not so much focused on personal conversion and repentance. In Advent we think about how we might discover what is most valuable in the midst of the busyness and ordinariness of life. We don't try to escape the world but, like a hiker on a mountaintop, we try to step above it all to see what is most important and be prepared to welcome God's presence.

So Advent is a great time to think about things we can do in the midst of a hectic season. Here are some suggestions:

- ◆ Join the choir this month. It is the season of the best music in our church.
- ◆ Be a part of our Christmas Pageant. We need everyone to make it a success.
- ◆ Come to Lessons and Carols or the Pageant and enjoy the message.
- ◆ Become a St. Bernard friend to a family in our parish.
- ◆ Help a charity or do something thoughtful for a person in need.

Laugh at all the shoppers, including yourself, secure in the knowledge that you have discovered the best part of the special season.

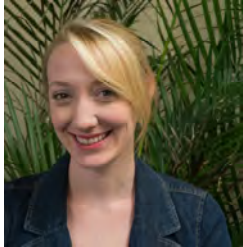

Eucharistic Adoration

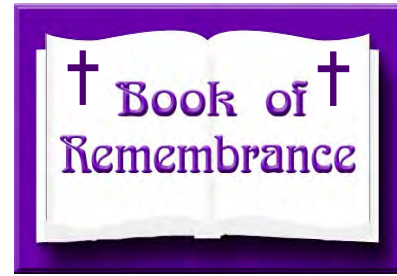

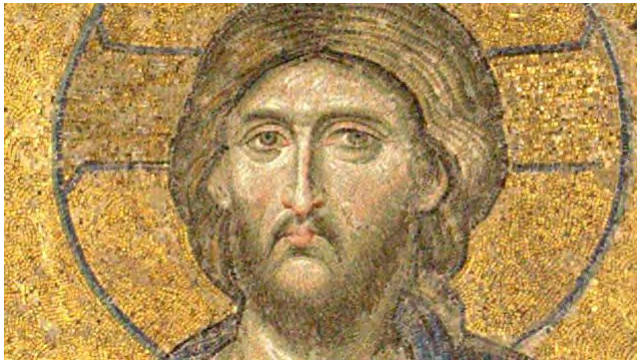
Our Lady of the Hamptons
