

Pastor's Letter

January 27/28

The Authority of Jesus

Dear Parish Family,

To whom do you turn for advice? As I thought about that question I realized that I am blessed to have so many people around me who are good authorities and can advise me very well. Fred, for example, knows everything about where to eat on Long Island. Steve is a wonderful chaplain and knows so much about the care of the sick. Mary is an insightful counselor and Bob is a fine and compassionate lawyer. Cathy is a superb teacher. Tony is the man for computers, Jen knows almost everything about children, and Curtis can help managing finances. The more I thought about this, the longer my list grew. You can try this yourself.

Who are the authorities in your life? You will notice that Google is not on my list though I often go to it for an answer! No source of information, however reliable, can replace the kind of advice and support that can come from someone who is close to you and cares about you.



The Ruins of the Capernaum Synagogue

The gospel today tells us that Jesus taught in the synagogue in Capernaum and that people were spellbound because he taught with authority and not as their Scribes. The Scribes were law teachers and keepers and were encyclopedic sources of information. But they did not touch the heart as Jesus did. In the last two weeks the gospel described how people became followers of Jesus. Today it describes how they come to listen to him.

One immediate consequence of Jesus' authority is that he could cast out demons. In the cultural world of Jesus, anyone who had a mental or emotional illness was thought to be possessed by a demon or evil spirit. Jesus meets many people so afflicted in the gospels. If we met them today we might recognize them as suffering from depression, anxiety, neurosis, schizophrenia, or some other psychiatric illness. The point was that the very presence of Jesus could restore people suffering in this way to sanity. Some onlookers praised Jesus as a wonderful healer and others were threatened by him.

But those who gathered in the synagogue that day were all deeply touched by his authority. We often think of authority as the prerogative of someone in power. But true authority is exercised when knowledge and ability are tied to compassion and mercy. In the bible we are told that it is not only important to receive the authority of Jesus but also to extend his kind of authority over others.

Take a moment to recognize the blessing of those in your life who bring you the gift of their authority. But more than that, resolve to become more and more that kind of servant authority to others. This is the power of Jesus working in each one of us.



Los signos que lleva a cabo Jesús testimonian que el Padre le ha enviado. Invitan a creer en Jesús. Concede lo que le piden a los que acuden a él con fe. Por tanto, los milagros fortalecen la fe en Aquel que hace las obras de su Padre: éstas testimonian que él es Hijo de Dios. Pero también pueden ser "ocasión de escándalo". No pretenden satisfacer la curiosidad ni los deseos mágicos. A pesar de tan evidentes milagros, Jesús es rechazado por algunos.

Al liberar a algunos hombres de los males terrenos del hambre, de la injusticia, de la enfermedad y de la muerte, Jesús realizó unos signos mesiánicos; no obstante, no vino para abolir todos los males aquí abajo, sino a liberar a los hombres de la esclavitud más grave, la del pecado, que es el obstáculo en su vocación de hijos de Dios y causa de todas sus servidumbres humanas. Permisos: Si viven afuera de la zona servida por el Apostolado Hispano, necesitan una carta de su párroco dándonos permiso para bautizar su hijo.



Create a Phone Book

1. Gather 3 X 5 index cards, pictures of friends and relatives, pens or fine tip markers, paper punch, ribbon.

3. Repeat this process for the rest of the people you would like in your personal phone book. If you don't have a picture, you can draw one.
4. When finished, punch two holes at the top of each card in the same place. Put ribbon through the holes and loosely tie the cards together so you can easily turn them.
