

Pastor's Letter

February 3/4

Dear Parish Family,

Families, Faith And Peter's Mother-in-Law

Saint Peter, our first pope, was married. We know this from the gospel of Mark which describes one of Jesus' first miraculous healings as the healing of Peter's mother-in-law. And marriage, of course, is how mothers-in-law are acquired!

I bring this up not to explain how it took the church more than 1100 years to require celibacy of its priests, bishops, and popes. That's a long and complicated history. I bring this up to have you look a bit more carefully at the role of family in the call to discipleship. I also thought it would get your attention.

Today's gospel is an example of faith and family. After the first healings of the possessed men in the synagogue, Peter brings Jesus directly to his home and to his ailing mother-in-law. I guess they had a good relationship. But Peter himself came to his calling because of the invitation of his brother Andrew. After his own call to discipleship, Andrew's first spreading of the gospel was to his brother Simon – who Jesus called Peter. The gospel also tells us that James and John were brother and left their father Zebedee upon their calling. Among Jesus' close friends was the family of Lazarus, Martha, and Mary.

Though the gospel is meant to be spread to the whole world, the first circle of faith is most often our family. It is interesting that when you ask people about their faith, how often they begin by talking about their family. "My grandparents always took us to church." "My mom taught us to pray." "I saw my father reading the bible." On the day of baptism there is a blessing for parents, praying that they will be the first and best teachers of their children in the ways of faith.

This Lent we are planning a special evening for families: A Family Lenten Evening of Renewal. You will be hearing more about this as Lent begins but the date will be Wednesday, March 14. It will be an opportunity for families to pray together and to think about how we can help each other live our Catholic faith.

So mark the date! Plan to come together. Bring your family. And don't forget to include your mother-in-law!



Reflections On the Gospel
February 4, 2018

Haven't we all at some time felt like Job in Sunday's first reading, full of drudgery, trouble, and hopelessness? But we know eventually God lifts Job from his misery. God heals. In the Gospel, we hear about much more healing as Jesus answers call after call with his healing powers. But then he needs to take a break. He goes off in the very early morning to pray; however, his retreat does not last long. People still want him, still need him. And he responds not with resistance, but with a sense of duty and compassion. Like St. Paul who follows his example, Jesus accepts his mission to preach and serve. It is more than a casual choice; it is a compulsion, a driving force. Can we be similarly immersed in a passion for Jesus, for God, that we, too, feel an inescapable urge to live our faith with such deep enthusiasm and energy as to give beyond what we think we are capable? Why not give it a try?

Por tanto, los milagros fortalecen la fe en Aquel que hace las obras de su Padre: éstas testimonian que él es Hijo de Dios. Pero también pueden ser "ocasión de escándalo". No pretenden satisfacer la curiosidad ni los deseos mágicos. A pesar de tan evidentes milagros, Jesús es rechazado por algunos.





STAINED GLASS PICTURES



A long time ago, very few people knew how to read, so they couldn't read the stories in the Bible.
