Pastor's Letter

Divine Mercy

Divine Mercy Sunday 2018

Dear Parish Family,

How many angels can fit on the head of a pin? Can God make a rock so big and heavy that God cannot lift it? If God knows everything, then God knows what I am going to do before I do it, so I should do what I want because that was what was going to happen anyway in God's plan. I bet you have heard plenty of puzzling God questions like these. God knows I have. The answers are: Angels do not sit on pins, ever. Stop asking questions with built in contradictions. And, I'm sorry, it is a bit of a mystery but you and I have free will. We make good and bad choices, and yes I am personally responsible.

But there is one puzzling God question that is asked often in the Bible and is much more important than the ones above. Here it is: How can God be both all just and all merciful? This question actually comes about because of some statements in the Bible about God. One main one is Psalm 85 where it is written: *Near indeed is God's salvation for those who fear him; glory dwelling in our land. For in the Lord kindness and truth shall meet; justice and peace will kiss. Truth will spring out of the earth and justice rain down from the heavens.*

In other words, how can it be that God will treat us with justice, absolutely fairly, rewarding goodness and punishing evil; and also treat us with mercy, forgiving, loving, and treating us better than we deserve? Pope Francis has taught many times over that this question is resolved on the cross where all of human evil is expiated and taken up into the love of the resurrection. This is divine mercy and it is appropriate that the Sunday after Easter would specially celebrate God's gift of mercy.

How should we deal with this question in our lives? Well, first it is good for us to recognize that without divine mercy we would be lost. Again the Psalmist tells us: If you, Lord, mark iniquity, Lord who can stand? Divine mercy is a gift we need. Second, it is good for us to reflect on how we might give this gift to others. Not dismissing the reality of sin and evil. Not giving up the demands of justice. But allowing mercy, our mercy, to rise above all the troubles of life.

I do not know about angels and heads of pins. But I do know that it is a wonderful gift to be loved justly and mercifully. Both in the giving and in the receiving.

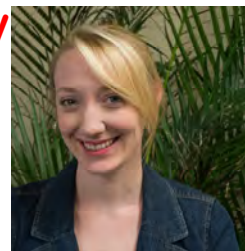

Imagine being falsely arrested, betrayed and denied by your supposed friends, tortured, and horrifically executed, and then returning to some of the very people who abandoned you. How would you greet them? Would your greeting be, "Peace be with you"? Would you be commissioning them to continue your work of love and mercy? Would you be giving them authority to forgive or not forgive according to their judgment? Chances are none of us would be that forgiving; yet, this is exactly what Jesus did. He gifted his frightened, depressed, and despondent disciples with the Holy Spirit and sent them forth. What a lesson for us, a lesson that says believe that even the weakest or seemingly most sinful among us can be rehabilitated! There is always hope. Trust in the power of the Spirit to restore our goodness and our strength. Give responsibility, and people may surprise us, rising to whatever an occasion demands of us. The early disciples formed a community in which all shared and no one was in need. This Easter season maybe we can follow in their footsteps.

Be A Year Round Friend and Supporter of SHJM

It's that time of year when the days get colder and a time when many SHJM parishioners have active plans. The migration of summer visitors, people heading to warmer climes for the winter, vacations, and travels all diminish the numbers of those who are able to worship here each week. But please remember that our parish itself is here year round and we never take a break from service and ministry. Last year we began a program of planned, automated giving, called First Fruits. It was a huge success and well over 10% of our supporters participate in this way. It enabled our parish to maintain a more consistent year round income. Automated giving can help insure that our parish remains strongly supported. So here are some ways you can do this:

First Fruits: The easiest, and best if you are technologically challenged is to enroll in First Fruits. All you need to do is give us a void check and fill out a First Fruits Form. You can get one on our website, at the rectory, or at the back church. First Fruits transfers a contribution either weekly or monthly from your checking account to the church.

Online Bill Pay: Chances are your bank already had a online check writing service called Bill Pay. If you have online access to your checking account you can set it up to write a regular check to SHJM. Just visit your online banking site and set it up for the contribution you desire. Remember to include your Envelope Number.

Pay Pal: Pay pal is another way you can make regular contributions. Soon it will also be a way that you can contribute using Credit Cards. Check our website and check back here for more information.

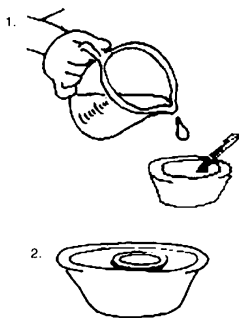

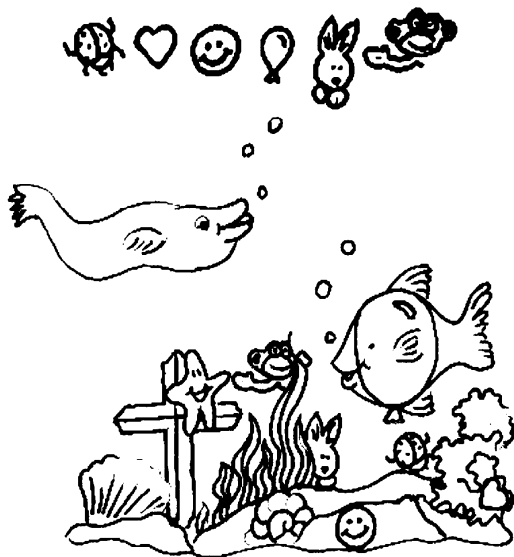
