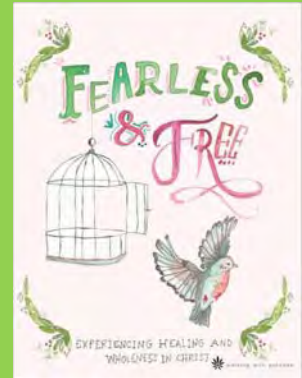

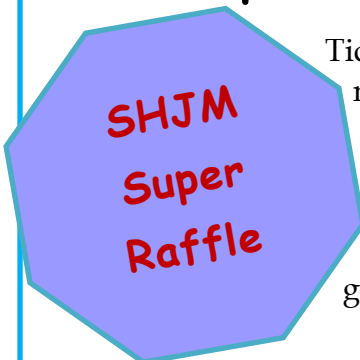

Reflections On the Gospel  
May 6, 2018

Sunday's readings are an invitation to love, and what an invitation that is! Think about it: To love one another as Jesus loves us can be an overwhelming challenge. He even says it quite bluntly: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." Thankfully, most of us never have to go that far to express our love, but it sure makes it clear that loving is no romantic walk in the park. How could we ever possibly meet such a challenge? Only one answer: God. God gives us what we need to love in this way, if we open ourselves and accept it. And if we welcome God's love and God's help in loving, we are very likely to see violence and injustice decrease, and peace and justice increase across all human divides. Now is the time to give it a try.

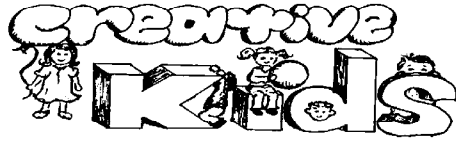
