Pastor's Letter

August 11/12

Dear Parish Family,

Jesus, the Bread of Life

For the last several weeks and for a couple more, our gospels have been about the miracles of the loaves and about Jesus as the bread of life. In the ancient world, bread was the most basic reality of everyday life. It was what people ate when there was little else. It was the minimum needed to survive. It was the only thing, save themselves, that the Jewish people took on their journey from slavery to freedom. It was the first thing that Jesus told his disciples to ask for in prayer. "Give us this day, our daily bread."

We read in these gospels that people were clamoring to be in Jesus' presence. They follow him and often run ahead of him along the shoreline of the Sea of Galilee. What are they looking for? Why are they so anxious to follow Jesus? In the gospels about the bread of life, they are looking for someone to fill their hunger. For some, it is elemental and physical. Jesus accuses the crowd of looking for him just to fill their empty stomachs. Their understanding is shallow. "I assure you," Jesus tells them, "You are not looking for me because you have seen these signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled." Jesus wants to feed them, but not just their bodies. He wants to feed souls and spirits.

Many of us come to Mass each week and we wonder if we will get anything out of it. And not getting anything out of it is the most oft given reason for not coming to Mass. But perhaps all of us need to be a bit more thoughtful in how we approach the bread of life. Think about this for a minute. How well do you know yourself as a person? We all might answer that by describing some information about ourselves: our likes and dislikes, quirks of personality, gifts, talents, and the like. But what if you really tried to get in touch with yourself on a very deep level? What makes you tick? What are you really hungering for in life? It is in that self-knowledge that Jesus most intimately meets his disciples. He blesses those who hunger for justice and for what is right. He heals those who hunger for wholeness. He forgives those who hunger for pardon. He gives life to those who look for something to live for.

Our lives these days are so complicated. It is easy to get lost amidst all the things that claim our attention. But what if we stopped for a moment and asked ourselves: for what do I really hunger? To know myself on that level is key to being here at the Eucharist and eager to know Jesus as the bread of life.

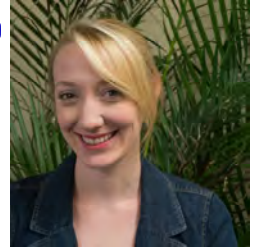

Reflections On the Gospel
August 12, 2018

How easily we can give up on God! Elijah is so disheartened that he just wants to die. Jesus's neighbors can't believe he is anything more than the kid next door grown up and now claiming to be more than he could possibly be. St. Paul puts it even more bluntly, warning his readers not to "grieve the Holy Spirit of God" which suggests that is exactly what some were doing. Despite our tendency to lose hope, to refuse to recognize God's work in others (or ourselves), to "grieve the Holy Spirit," God does not give up on us. Instead, Sunday's readings remind us how persistent God is in providing for us, in literally and figuratively feeding us, in forgiving us and loving us. In gratitude, let us do as St. Paul advised: to love, be compassionate, and forgive.

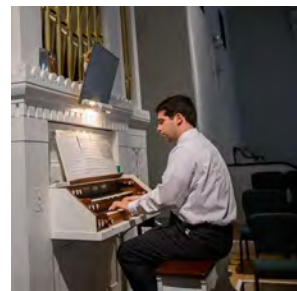

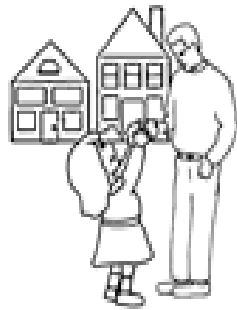
Giving of the Bread

You will need:

- 1 package refrigerated bread loaf
- butter

1. Cook bread as directed on the package.
2. Spread butter over the top.
3. When cool, place it on a platter.
4. Give it to a neighbor or friend.
